

Celebrating 10 Years of Ministry!



This year marks the 10th year of Threshold's Ministry. To mark this milestone, Leslie Raymer and volunteers threw a celebration cookout for guests of Threshold, members of DPC, and

community supporters. More than 75 guests and 15 volunteers enjoyed hot dogs (prepared by Scott Overcarsh, Steering Committee member) and side dishes in the shade on the parking lot of Sycamore House.







This ministry, established by then Associate Minister Ken Hughes, has had 4 directors, and has grown from seeing 208 guests its first year to more than 1000 visits a year in 2023. Over the course of our 10 plus year history, Threshold has developed rich relationships with First Baptist Church of Decatur (partnering to provide motel stays and other financial assistance), A Home for Everyone in DeKalb (partnering to provide rental and move in assistance), Decatur Emergency Assistance Ministry--DEAM (providing motel and rental assistance; collecting food supplies each year for DEAM), Revolution Doughnuts (free doughnuts for guests), and the Furniture Bank of Metro Atlanta. During the COVID19 crisis, Threshold altered our operations because of the pandemic, but importantly, we <u>never</u> closed. During this time, Threshold converted many services to virtual delivery, and added a dedicated phone line staffed by our Ministry Assistant Linda Huffine. In 2022, Threshold developed a partnership with Legal Aid of Atlanta (monthly in person clinic), and has begun sharing space with

Michael Turner, a housing specialist working with DeKalb County in 2023. Threshold holds an annual coat/blanket drive every fall to assist our unhoused guests during the winter months.

Originally from Meriwether County, Georgia, Rosie has called DeKalb County home for her adult life. However, circumstances took a difficult turn when she found herself at risk of losing her rental home. Rosie turned to Threshold Ministry in search of support. Little did she know that this encounter would not only change her life but also inspire her to become a shining example of compassion and service. Motivated by her own experience, Rosie discovered that she had a lot to offer others in need. She recognized the power of a warm smile and a helping hand, and she wanted to make a difference in the lives of her neighbors who were also facing homelessness or at risk of losing their homes. A "Supersized" Response: During the month of July, Decatur Presbyterian Church was the "partner church" responsible for collecting needed food and hygiene items for the DEAM Pantry at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. DPC's response was WONDERFUL!! Because of ALL the many items donated by individuals and families and the generous monetary donation given by the Cornerstone Class (Costco shopping!!), weekly trips were made to DEAM with "trunk" loads of donations. From hundreds of pounds of canned fruit, soup, chicken and tuna . . . to juice pouches and yellow rice. . . to hundreds of rolls of toilet paper, your loving and caring response to the needs of others helped to FILL the shelves at the DEAM Pantry. This year alone DEAM has provided over 65,000 pounds of food to more than 200 households. Without the weekly and monthly commitments of its "partner churches," DEAM would not be able to provide weekly food assistance to these households. May the generosity of our congregation continue to serve the poor and the unhoused!





We welcome Marlene White as she begins a year of service as a Master's of Social Work intern at Threshold Ministry. As part of her education requirement, she will serve as an MSW intern at the DPC Threshold Ministry for twelve months, beginning August 28th, 2023.

Marlene brings a wealth of experience to assist Threshold in our ministry with our unhoused neighbors in Decatur and those who are at risk of losing their housing. Marlene will provide social service counselling services to Threshold guests which will begin with initial interviews and assessments of their wants and needs. She will then work with Threshold staff/volunteers to assist our guests in finding affordable housing options, and connecting them to resources which can help them reach their goals.

Marlene relocated to Georgia 25 years ago. Marlene is a native New Yorker but considers herself a peachy - apple because of how long she has called Georgia home. Marlene lives in Decatur and is the proud parent of two daughters and has one grandchild. Marlene holds a master's degree in education with a specialization in enrollment management and, for over three decades, has coupled the experience of her life's journey with her professional knowledge to offer culturally sensitive, quality direct services to marginalized groups.

For over two decades, Marlene has provided services to at-risk individuals and families on the teams of the Women's Resource Center to End Domestic Violence, International Women's House, the DeKalb County Community Services Board, and the DeKalb County Public Library. In 2007, Marlene began service as a volunteer at Hagar's House, the emergency shelter of Decatur Cooperative Ministry (DCM). Over the past fifteen years, Marlene has served in various capacities at DCM and currently serves in executive leadership. Marlene fondly recalls meeting Cheryl Sullivan, Catherine Carter, and many other Decatur Presbyterian Church members as they volunteered at DCM.

Marlene will work with Threshold on Tuesdays and Thursdays, initially with guests who have received ARP funds. Please join us in welcoming Marlene to Threshold Ministry.

Over the last decade, the session of Decatur Presbyterian Church (DPC) has intentionally sought to balance a strong inward focus – e.g., caring for one another and nurturing one another in the family of faith – with a stronger outward focus on our community. One of the scripture texts that informed this balance is from the prophet Jeremiah: Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare... For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and

When one of our former Associate Pastors, Ken Hughes, recognized the need to formalize our assistance ministry, we initiated Threshold Ministry in 2013. This ministry, which now employs two part-time staff and many volunteers, exists as a direct response to the constant human needs at our doorstep. Hospitality is one of the touchstones of our Threshold Ministry, welcoming people in the name of Jesus Christ, listening to their needs, and offering a bag lunch or cup of hot coffee on a cold day. While we provide a number of direct services – like Marta cards for doctor appointments or work needs, some direct assistance for rent and utilities, cheap phones in order to connect to services - our primary goal has always been to come alongside individuals and help them navigate the disparate and sometimes chaotic service provider system. We often have Threshold guests worship with us or participate in Wednesday night suppers.

For many years, DPC sat "fortress-like" at the corner of Church and Sycamore Streets in the middle of downtown Decatur, not intimately connected to its neighborhood. Today, our congregation is known as a church that cares about its neighborhood and continually invites our neighbors not only to join with us in worship, but also to participate in everything from youth group to service projects to events like Blessing of the Pets or Trunk-n-Treat. The post-pandemic Church has its challenges, but a congregation that intentionally seeks the welfare of its surrounding community will ultimately find itself "filled full," full of the fruits of the Holy Spirit – *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, and self-control*. By God's grace, may these gifts be yours and yours to share.
